#### Jeremiah's Call to Israel

Jeremiah spoke to a rebellious Israel

<sup>16</sup> Thus says the Lord of hosts,

"Do not listen to the words of the prophets who are prophesying to you.

They are leading you into futility;

They speak a vision of their own imagination,

Not from the mouth of the LORD.

#### Jeremiah's Call to Israel

- Jeremiah spoke to a rebellious Israel
- Jeremiah was opposed by a group of false prophets who claimed that the people of Israel did not need to repent. Jeremiah 23:16-20

Then the word of the LORD came to me saying, 6 "Can I not, O house of Israel, deal with you as this potter *does*?" declares the LORD. "Behold, like the clay in the potter's hand, so are you in My hand, O house of Israel.

Jeremiah 18:5-8

<sup>7</sup> At one moment I might speak concerning a nation or concerning a kingdom to uproot, to pull down, or to destroy *it*; <sup>8</sup> if that nation against which I have spoken turns from its evil, I will relent concerning the calamity I planned to bring on it.

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- **Lesson**: Our reaction to God's sovereignty does not just affect us, it affects others who are influenced by us.

## Abraham Pleading for Sodom

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- <u>Lesson</u>: It is good to pray for mercy for the lost, but we do so recognizing that God is right and wise in His judgement of sin.

• 2 Samuel 6:6-15

<sup>6</sup>But when they came to the threshing floor of Nacon, Uzzah reached out toward the ark of God and took hold of it, for the oxen nearly upset it. <sup>7</sup> And the anger of the LORD burned against Uzzah, and God struck him down there for his irreverence; and he died there by the ark of God. 8 David became angry because of the Lord's outburst against Uzzah, and that place is called Perez-uzzah to this day.

9 So David was afraid of the LORD that day; and he said, "How can the ark of the LORD come to me?" 10 And David was unwilling to move the ark of the LORD into the city of David with him; but David took it aside to the house of Obed-edom the Gittite. 11 Thus the ark of the LORD remained in the house of Obed-edom the Gittite three months, and the LORD blessed Obed-edom and all his household.

12 Now it was told King David, saying, "The LORD has blessed the house of Obed-edom and all that belongs to him, on account of the ark of God." David went and brought up the ark of God from the house of Obed-edom into the city of David with gladness. 13 And so it was, that when the bearers of the ark of the LORD had gone six paces, he sacrificed an ox and a fatling.

<sup>14</sup> And David was dancing before the LORD with all his might, and David was wearing a linen ephod. 15 So David and all the house of Israel were bringing up the ark of the LORD with shouting and the sound of the trumpet.

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- David is angry and afraid
- Time passes, David hears of God's blessing
- Greater joy
- Greater reverence
- Greater worship

## Lesson:

1. We must be honest with God. But we must submit to

Him, not to our emotions.

2. God can change our hearts from anger and fear to

awe.

## Merciless Prophet

• Jonah 4:2-3, 11

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- Jonah did not want God to be merciful to Ninevah
- Lesson: A proper understanding of God's sovereignty
  does not make us look down on others, but makes us look
  first and foremost to God for mercy.

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- God alone provides salvation through faith in His son

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- Does our reaction to the sovereignty of God point others to God or lead them away?
- Are we honest with God? Are we willing to submit to Him and be changed?
- Do we recognize the mercy we have received? Do we recognize the peril the lost are in and the desire God has for their repentance?
