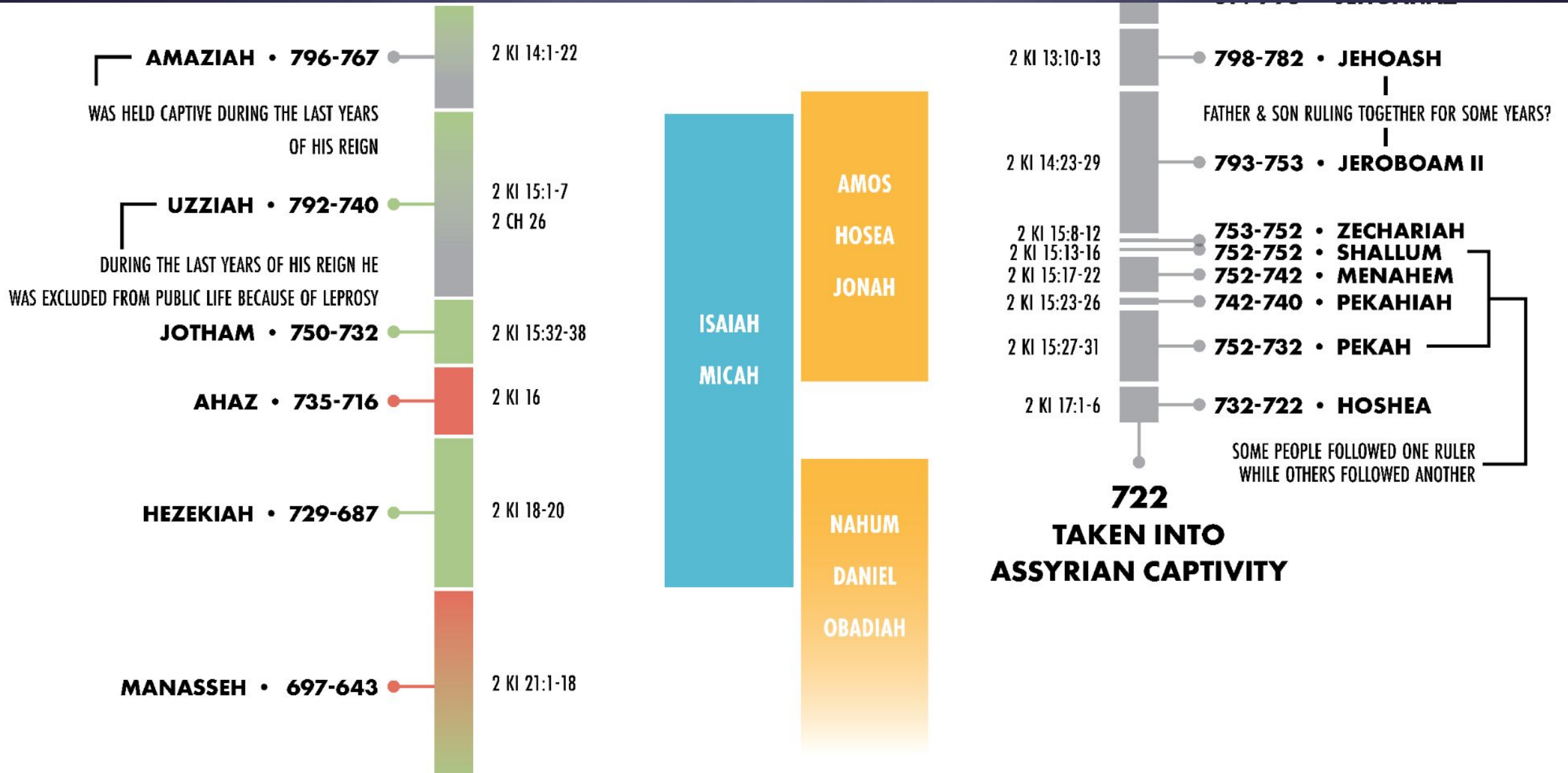

For her wound is incurable, and it has come to Judah;
it has reached to the gate of My people, to Jerusalem.

Impending Exile (1:14-16)

Make yourselves bald and cut off your hair, for the
children of your delight; make yourselves as bald as
the eagle, for they shall go from you into exile.

Hear, you people, all of you

Cause

Mind (2:1-3)

Woe to those who devise wickedness and work evil on their beds! When the morning dawns, they perform it, because it is in the power of their hand.

Words (2:4-7)

"Do not preach"--thus they preach-- "one should not preach of such things; disgrace will not overtake us."

Actions (2:8-10)

The women of my people you drive out from their delightful houses; from their young children you take away My splendor forever.

I will surely assemble all of you, O Jacob;
I will gather the remnant of Israel;
I will **set them together like sheep in a fold**,
like a flock in its pasture,
a noisy multitude of men.



Micah 2:12

Hear, you heads of Jacob

Judgment

Silence (3:4 & 3:6-7)

Therefore it shall be night to you, without vision, and darkness to you, without divination. The sun shall go down on the prophets, and the day shall be black over them;

Destruction (3:12)

Therefore because of you Zion shall be plowed as a field; Jerusalem shall become a heap of ruins, and the mountain of the house a wooded height.

Hear, you heads of Jacob

Cause

Leaders (3:2)

you who hate the good and love the evil, who tear the skin from off My people and their flesh from off their bones,

Prophets (3:5)

...who cry "Peace" when they have something to eat, but declare war against him who puts nothing into their mouths..

But as for me, I am **filled with power,**
with the Spirit of the LORD,
and with justice and might,
to declare to Jacob his transgression
and to Israel his sin.



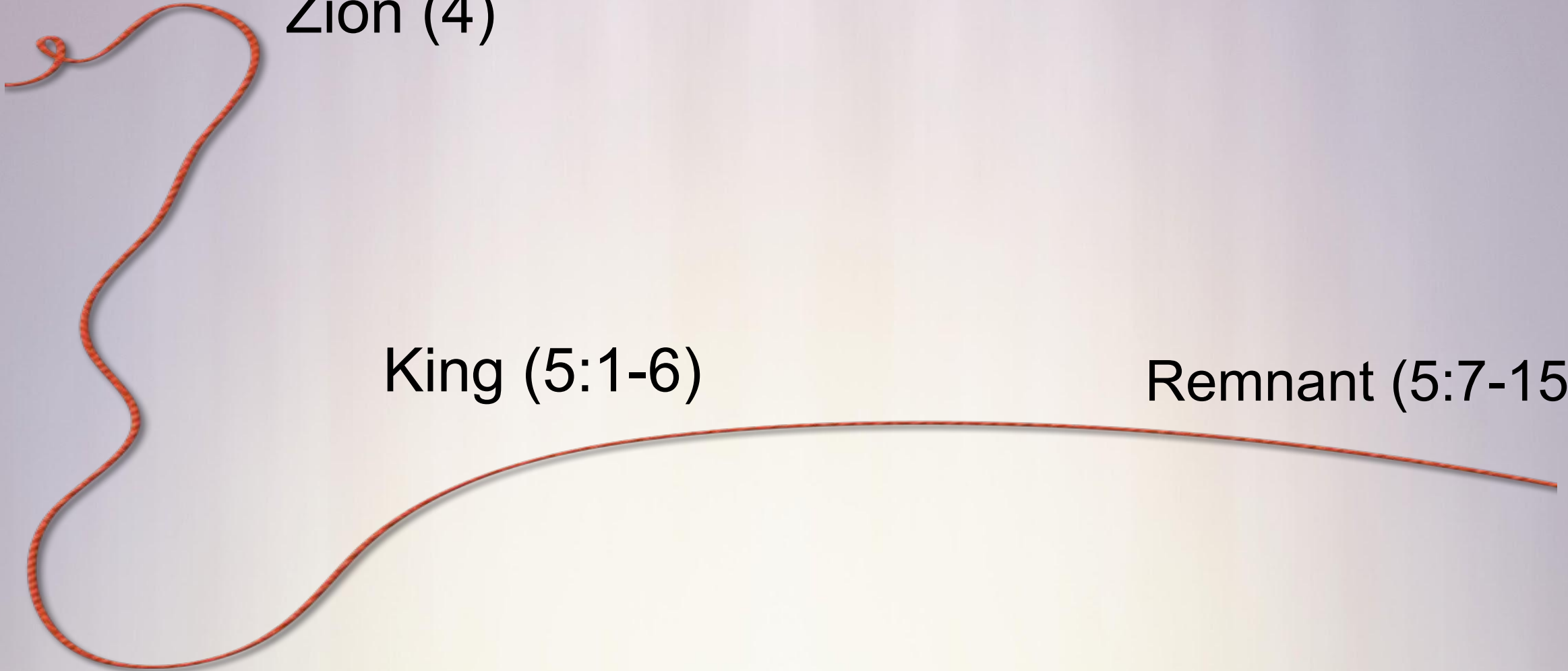
Micah 3:8

King (5:1-6)

But you, O Bethlehem Ephrathah,
who are too little to be among the clans of Judah,
from you shall come forth for Me

Micah 5:4

Hear what the LORD says:

(6:1-5)

Arise, plead your case before the mountains, and let the hills hear your voice.

Hear, you mountains, the indictment of the LORD, and you enduring foundations of the earth, for the LORD has an indictment against His people, and He will contend with Israel.

"O My people, what have I done to you? How have I wearied you? Answer Me!

Hear what the LORD says:

(6:1-5)

For I brought you up from the land of Egypt and redeemed you from the house of slavery, and I sent before you Moses, Aaron, and Miriam.

O My people, remember what Balak king of Moab devised, and what Balaam the son of Beor answered him, and what happened from Shittim to Gilgal, that you may know the righteous acts of the LORD."

The Result of the Lord's Judgment

Destruction (6:9-16)

The voice of the LORD cries to the city-- and it is sound wisdom to fear Your name: "Hear of the rod and of Him who appointed it!

Therefore I strike you with a grievous blow, making you desolate because of your sins.

Salvation (7:1-17)

But as for me, I will look to the LORD; I will wait for the God of my salvation; my God will hear me.

Shepherd Your people with Your staff, the flock of Your inheritance,

Who is a God like You, pardoning iniquity
and passing over transgression
for the remnant of His inheritance?
He does not retain His anger forever,
because He delights in steadfast love.
