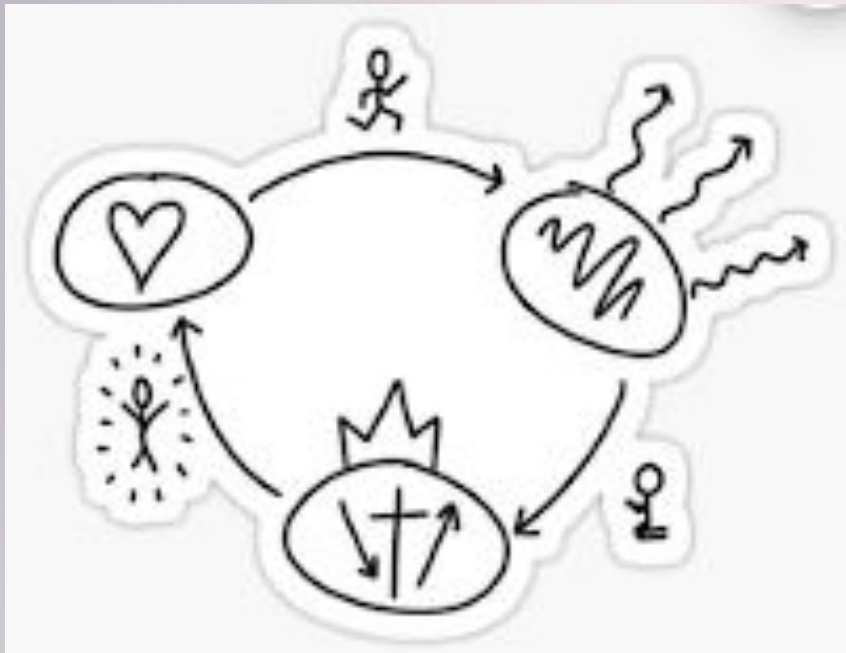


## As You Go

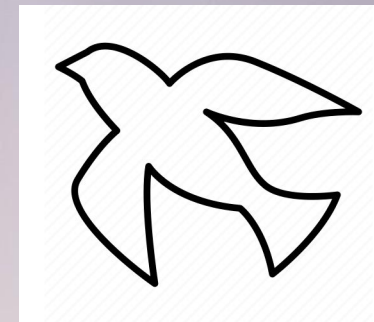
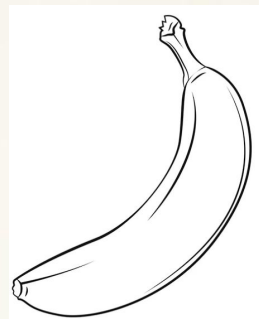



# Communion


