

Philippians 1:18


Philippians: Chapter 1









Hydrocephalus Pressure on the brain

T & E's example of humility

(Phil 2:19-30)

I hope in the Lord Jesus to send Timothy to you soon, so that I too may be cheered by news of you.

I have thought it necessary to send to you

Epaphroditus my brother and fellow worker and fellow soldier, and your messenger and minister to my need,

Philippians 2:19 & 25

For I have no one like him, who will be genuinely concerned for your welfare.

For he nearly died for the work of Christ, risking his life to complete what was lacking in your service to me.

Philippians: Chapter 2

- Paul's example of humility
 - Minimum (Duty): Do all things without grumbling or disputing
 - Ideal (Joy): Be glad and rejoice with others
- Timothy and Epaphroditus example of humility
 - Minimum (Duty): Go where sent
 - Ideal (Joy): Be of genuine concern & service

- Righteousness through faith in Christ
 - Minimum (Duty): Count it all as lost for the sake of Christ
 - Ideal (Joy): Share in His suffering

Brothers, I do not consider that I have made it my own.

But one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and

straining forward to what lies ahead,

I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus.

Brothers, join in imitating me, and keep your eyes on those who walk according to the example you have in us.
